September PWD Increase

Beginning September 1, 2016, everyone who has the Persons with Disabilities Designation will receive a \$25 monthly increase, and a \$52 transportation support allowance.

People with the Persons with Disabilities designation receiving assistance can choose to receive the transportation allowance in the form of a subsidized BC Bus Pass or on your assistance cheque.

It is important to note that we are also eliminating the \$45 bus pass administration fee and the need for an annual sign-up process.
